You will be introduced to a variety of machining techniques used by various skilled workers in the machining and tooling manufacturing sectors such as: Tool and Die Maker, Tool Maker, General Machinist, Machine Tool Builder and Integrator, and Pattern Maker. You will practice the safe setup and operation of different types of machine tools including: Engine Lathes, Milling Machines, Drill Presses, and Pedestal Grinders. Students are taught safe lifting techniques, as well as rigging and hoisting. You will also learn to assemble and disassemble mechanical equipment such as motors, gear boxes etc. You will be exposed to the basic fundamentals of oxy-fuel cutting, brazing and welding, plasma cutting, as well as shielded metal arc welding.
